

## WHAT DO THE SCRIPTURES CLAIM ABOUT THEMSELVES

1. The Scriptures claim to be inspired by the Holy Spirit, and not by the imaginations of mankind.

2 Timothy 3:16 // 2 Peter 1:20

2. The prophets of the scriptures claim to speak on behalf of God.

Deuteronomy 4:2 // 1 Samuel 15:10 // 1 Kings 16:7 // 1 Kings 21:17 // Isaiah 38:4 // Jeremiah 1:2

3. New Testament writers affirm that the writers of the Hebrew scriptures wrote by the Spirit of God.

4. The scriptures claim that the Word they speak from God is eternal.

5. The scriptures claim to lead us into truth perfectly (infallibility).

6. The Mosaic law-covenant claims the highest authority to regulate Jewish life.

7. Later prophets recognized the divine authority of the earlier prophets.

8. Jesus confirmed the authority of the Law and the Prophets to regulate Jewish life.

9. The authors of the Hebrew scriptures and New Testament scriptures had every intention of writing historically accurate accounts, not mythologies or inflated traditions.
